Eating Made Easy – Meal Plan Information

You've got a lot on your plate. Did you leave room for food? Choose your **Residence Meal Plan**. No Cooking. No Cleaning. No Shopping. Real convenience, flexibility and variety.

1. LITE MEAL PLAN - \$600 (per term): For students who choose to eat 3-4 meals per week and the occasional beverage or snack on campus.

Or choose a **tax exempt meal plan, with a 13% savings...**

2. VALUE MEAL PLAN - \$1,000 (per term): For students who choose to eat 10 meals per week on campus.

3. MID MEAL PLAN - \$1,500 (per term): For students who choose to eat 10 meals per week, daily coffee, beverages or snacks and who will spend some weekends on campus.

4. HEARTY MEAL PLAN - \$2,000 (per term): For students who choose to eat 2-3 meals per day and who will spend many weekends on campus.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - ETHERNET CORD FOR YOUR COMPUTER - Toiletries (soap, shampoo, toilet paper, kleenex etc.) - Clothes (not too many) - Posters & <u>White Adhesive</u> (refer to Decorating Policy in Student Handbook) - Towels - Sheets, blankets, pillow, comforter for a single bed - Cooking utensils, dishes, cutlery - Cutlery tray and drying rack for dishes - Plastic containers (i.e. Tupperware) - Clothes hangers - Wastepaper basket for bedroom and bathroom - Laundry basket, detergent, fabric softener - Large garbage bags - Cleaning supplies (non-abrasive), mop, broom, dustpan - Alarm clock - First Aid Supplies (i.e. cough syrup, bandages, medicines) - Small kitchen appliances (i.e. kettle, toaster) - Sewing Kit - Flashlight - Drying rack for clothes - Games, Sports Equipment - Bicycle and lock (must be kept in bicycle storage) - Umbrella 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Refrigerator, stove, microwave - Bedroom furniture (bed, closet, dresser, desk, desk chair) - Love seat(s) and coffee table in living room - Kitchen table & chairs in dining area - Shower curtains - Recycling container - Compost container - Garbage container for kitchen - Towel bar and coat hook in bedroom - Mirror in bedroom and washrooms - Tack board on desk - Vacuum cleaner (1 per floor, borrow it by seeing your RA/SRA) - Laundry facilities <p><u>OPTIONAL ITEMS TO BRING WITH YOU</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Small refrigerator/freezer (max 5 cubic feet)

Additional furniture is not allowed. We **do not permit** sofas, futons, table-size games or other large pieces of furniture to be moved into the Residence. Any specialized (medical) equipment such as office chairs, mattresses, etc. must be cleared with the Residence Manager prior to the day of move-in.

The College assumes no liability for lost, stolen or damaged items of personal property, no matter how it is caused. It is the responsibility of the student to arrange for insurance coverage for personal property. We encourage you to contact an insurance company to arrange for Tenant Insurance or check your family policy, as it may cover your property.

There is no storage available outside of your room; we suggest you bring **"necessities only"**
