With your donations, we continue to grow the projects and initiatives which drive student success. Through your philanthropic contributions, Fleming College has grown to become a recognized leader in innovative program delivery, applied research practices and leading edge teaching and learning facilities.

Fleming College Foundation received 959 bursary applications in the 2010 fall semester. This is the highest number of applications ever received in a single application period in the history of the Foundation and is reflective of the increasing student need for financial assistance. Your contributions, through individual and corporate donations, as well as your participation at events such as the International Culinary Festival have helped to grow our endowed bursary funds. Since the 2005 inception of the Ontario Trust for Student Support program, the Foundation has secured in excess of \$2.3 M for student financial support.



Your commitment to students provides Fleming the opportunity to constantly update facilities and learning environments. In the past six years, Fleming College Foundation has raised \$9.2 M for four separate capital projects. This total includes \$4.5 M raised in partnership with St. Joseph's Care Foundation for the construction of St. Joseph's at Fleming; the first oncampus health-care learning facility in the Ontario Colleges system. A new

campus was constructed in Haliburton and new wings have been added to both the Frost and Sutherland campuses. In addition to these projects, the Peterborough Sport and Wellness Centre (PSWC) was built at the Sutherland campus. This state-of the art athletic facility has contributed to an increase in the amount of skilled and dedicated athletes enrolling in full time programs at the college. :



Living, Learning, Caring Campaign



The construction of St. Joseph's at Fleming has encouraged teaching and learning for programs in many schools of study at Fleming, but specifically in the School of Education, Health and Wellness; from the on-site nursery school, to applied projects for Health Information Management students and outreach opportunities for the Massage Therapy program.

In the 2010-2015 Strategic Plan, Fleming has identified building

community relationships as a key priority, particularly with the partnership with St. Joseph's at Fleming through the Institute for Healthy Aging, which will also facilitate applied research in this field.

The overall accessibility for clinical placements in the Occupational Therapist and Physiotherapist Assistant, Fitness and Health Promotion, Health Information Management, Personal

Support Worker, Practical Nursing and Collaborative B.Sc.N programs has encouraged increased interest in Fleming and these health-care programs.

Located in St. Joseph's at Fleming is the Fleming Child Care Centre, which the Early Childhood Education program utilizes as a field placement opportunity for students. In addition to using the centre for placements, having it located in St. Joseph's at Fleming encourages facility residents to become involved in intergenerational activities with both Fleming students and children enrolled at the Centre.

Many full-time Fleming programs are able to use St. Joseph's at Fleming for program-related field placements. Successful field placements often lead to Fleming graduates staying in our local community to live and work.

Brian L. Desbiens Technology Wing

The Brian L. Desbiens Technology wing has significantly enhanced the functionality of the Peterborough Campus. This wing has provided much needed classroom and applied learning space. The addition of three SMART classrooms, a large lecture theatre and a 75-seat computer lab has benefited many programs offered at the Sutherland campus. In addition to these classrooms, labs have been assigned to the Computer Security Investigations (CSI) and **Health Information Management** Programs (HIM). These two programs are unique in the Ontario College

System. The three-year CSI curriculum provides students with the knowledge and skills to prepare for industry certification in both the computer forensics and networking disciplines while the HIM program is one of only three Canadian Health Information Management Association (CHIMA) recognized college programs available in Ontario.

The state-of-the-art Engineering Commons, located in the galleria portion of the wing, has allowed Fleming to increase enrolment in programs offered in Skilled Trades. With the technical skills shortage as identified through both governmental and industry communications, this enrolment increase is exceptionally beneficial to our communities both regionally and on a national level.

The beautiful architecture of the Technology Wing has encouraged many groups to host their events oncampus. One such notable event was a visit from Primer Dalton McGuinty and his Cabinet members. The Fleming College Technology Wing space was chosen to host a special Queen's Park, off-site meeting.

The enhancement of Fleming College Facilities has been a key component in support of the overall enrolment success we have experienced. This year Fleming experienced it highest enrolment in its 43-year history with our fall 2010 full-time student population at 6,058 students.



Haliburton School of the Arts

The Haliburton School of The Arts (HSTA) campus is a wonderful reflection of Fleming College's dedication to providing outstanding facilities and top-notch learning environments to its students.

Situated in natural setting of Glebe Park, students have day and evening access to 12 of the finest studio spaces in the college system. Our magnificent new building and state of the art studios with impressive ventilation systems provide a safe place for our students to create their art.

Our new facilities, have enabled the campus to expand its programming and increase enrolment significantly. This September we experienced a 40% increase in enrolment that would not be possible without the new HSTA building. Since the building opened in 2005, the college has added full-time certificates in photo arts, glassblowing, fibre arts, jewellery arts, and sculpture as well as a diploma in visual and creative arts. We are also looking forward



to the "next generation" of arts programming at the campus which will include a certificate in digital image design and an advance diploma in graphic design.

In addition to our amazing arts programs, we also have Canada's first sustainable building design and construction (SBDC) program. The success of SBDC has also been expanded to include a program in sustainable renovations. The new classroom space on campus has made

this expanded portfolio possible. The beauty of the new Haliburton campus and all that it represents provides the Haliburton community with a sense of pride and ownership. It has made a difference in so many ways! ::

Frost Campus

The Environmental Technology Wing is a strong and defined testament of Fleming College's commitment to sustainability as outlined in the vision, mission and value statements.

The Discovery Trail, Living Wall, Centre for Alternative Wastewater Treatment (CAWT), the geothermal heating and cooling system and the green roof are all features used in teaching and learning for programs offered at Frost campus. In addition to these features, the wing also houses the Fleming College Geomatics Institute, learning commons and biocommons.

In addition to the annual United Way Gala, various community groups use the wing for their events. The structure itself is open and natural light abounds bringing hundreds of guests on-campus each year for educational tours about the benefits of the space.

Fleming College set the standard of leadership in Ontario's post secondary institutions with respect to environmental programs and practices. As a leader in environmental education and applied research, the Environmental Technology Wing is home to the Student Sustainability Group who works in tandem with the Frost Sustainable Campus Initiative. This group is comprised of student leaders, faculty, staff, and academic and operations leaders from the Frost Campus who meet regularly throughout the year to plan,

implement, and evaluate campus sustainability initiatives.

The Centre for Alternative Wastewater Treatment (CAWT) promotes constructed wetlands and other innovative forms of wastewater treatment through applied research, education, and demonstration projects. The wastewater from the washroom facilities located in the wing is treated in the CAWT using student constructed wetland technology. :

Each year we are approached by corporations, individuals and families wishing to establish bursaries to support Fleming students in their academic journeys. Currently, Fleming College has 68 endowed bursaries and awards through the provincial Ontario Trust for Student Support (OTSS) program.

Since January 1, 2010 four new OTSS funds have been established.

Cpl Nick Bulger Memorial Student Bursary

Cpl Nick Bulger, a student in the Fire, Safety and Security Management

diploma program at Fleming College, had dreams of becoming a fulltime firefighter. After leaving Fleming, Nick chose the military as an interim career, in order to



career, in order to gain experience before applying to Fire Services departments. Nick was killed while serving in Afghanistan in 2009.

Nick worked to put himself through Fleming, both during the

summer and the school year, and he remained sensitive to fiscal challenges that education brings. This bursary, in Nick's memory, is meant to provide some financial relief to other students who, like Nick, are pursuing their dreams.

Peterborough Horticultural Society Endowed Award

Established in 1861, the Peterborough Horticultural Society (PHS) is one of the oldest members of the Ontario Horticultural Association.

In 2001 the scholarship program was established. In addition to providing six awards of \$1,000 each to local students studying in horticulture related programs, a permanent award was established at Trent University in 2008. In keeping with the PHS commitment to our community, an endowed bursary has now also been established at Fleming College.

PHS has contributed to a number of community beautification projects in and around Peterborough. PHS was able to make this generous donation because of a bequest left to the society by Fern Alma Rahmel.

Fallen Heroes Endowed Student Bursary
