endowment funds to provide financial assistance for Ontario college and university students. An additional facet of the program also provided enhanced matching to institutions that had less than \$1,000 endowed per student, three-to-one for funds raised above their historical fundraising average.

Through the OTSS program and the generosity of donors like you, we are thrilled to announce that with matched gift funding included in 2011/12 we raised \$595,705. Exceeding our fundraising ceiling for the third straight year!

This past fall alone we were able to assist 196 students with over \$147,000 in financial assistance, an average of \$750 per student. These funds helped students to pay their tuition, buy text books, support their families, but most importantly, provided them with peace of mind, reduced their financial worries and allowed them to focus on the reason they are here, their education.

Since 2005 our team has worked diligently to reach our fundraising ceiling each year, and through the program we have been able to secure with matched gift funding, endowed funds totalling \$3.8 million dollars. A total of 87 new endowed funds were created through the OTSS program. Your generosity has allowed us to help hundreds of students reach their educational goals. For this we are truly grateful.

We will continue to focus our efforts on securing funds that will assist students in financial need, putting our focus on building existing endowments and creating new "flow-through" funding for students to meet these needs. Our commitment to students will not end with the OTSS program. We will continue to provide our donors with opportunities to be the difference in the lives of Fleming College students. ••

What is the difference between an endowment and a flow-through?

- An endowment fund is a fund where the principal is held in tact and the interest earned annually is distributed. This guarantees a source of funding for bursaries in perpetuity.
- A flow-through fund is where all gifts received are pooled and distributed within the year that it is raised.

Alumni Advisory Council: Welcome to our Newest Volunteers!



here are million dollar smiles on the faces of current Blasting Techniques and Resources
Drilling and Blasting students as they talk about the impact that the new equipment provided by Duane Parnham's generous gift to their programs has had on their education.

"Last year we were working on a drill that was outdated. The new equipment is a lot simpler to use and gives us many more options," said 4th semester Drilling and Blasting Techniques student Sanford Mick.

When asked what they thought of the new equipment, 2nd semester

Blasting Techniques students Joel Ross and Chris Hellam broke out in smiles and in unison replied, "It's awesome!"

"It's easier to use than I expected," Joel continued, "there's more electronic functions, but you still need to incorporate your other senses which is important in drilling."

"This is equipment that professionals are using in the field right now. It's great to be able to have that experience on our resumes," said Chris.

"Yes, it's definitely more efficient equipment," added Sanford.

Mr. Parnham is thrilled by the reactions of the students.

"These comments are so gratifying to me that I hardly know how to respond, but...I have had a great many opportunities to see for myself what a difference technology combined with experience and knowledge can and does accomplish, and for these young people I hope these tools will be a stepping stone towards their careers in an ever changing, ever challenging world."

Sanford will graduate this spring and has already lined up some interviews for employment in the field. Chris and Joel will both return in September 2012 to complete year two of the Resources Drilling and Blasting program, having advanced standing for completing the Blasting Techniques program. Joel aspires to a career in underground mineral mining and Chris hopes to move to Northern Canada or to Australia with his unique skill set.

"Many industries need drillers, wells, construction, mining...we're lucky that there is a lot of opportunity in our field," said Sanford.

A renewel of the current training centre will be complete in June 2012 and the Centre will be named, "The Parnham RDB Training Centre."

In addition to the equipment and building upgrades, \$200,000 of Mr. Parnham's gift will also go towards an endowment to assist students at the Frost campus who are in financial need to complete their studies. :
