The Diversity Office invites you to participate in the Positive Space Education Program and support an inclusive environment for members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ) community.

This program aims to help each of us to identify our own biases, feel more prepared to challenge stereotypes about sexual orientation and gender identity, and know where to find support on campus or in the community.

It was developed in partnership with Peterborough AIDS Resource Network (PARN), the Fleming Ass'n of Queer Students (FAQS) and the Frost Gay Straight Alliance (GSA), and with input from many allies in both the academic and service areas across the college.

Level One "Shifting OUTlook" is a 2 hour session introducing us to issues of orientation and identity, the impact of homophobia, and the "alphabet soup" of LGBTQ++ definitions. Participants will receive a newly designed, removable Positive Space sticker and a certificate of participation.
