	Fleming College grad report 2013/2014 indicates that 57% of grads are working in their field 6 months after graduation.
Additional Labour Market Information (LMI)	The outlook for working in Canada for this occupation is good (i.e. 3 out of 3 stars) with this industry undergoing transformation as there is a shift from coal burning plants to alternative forms of energy such as gas or biomass-fuelled production. Also, as utility companies aim to become more efficient, the elmination or re-engineering of work processes may impact employment growth. Since some power generation stations operate 24 hours a day, workers who can accommodate a flexible work schedule will be more employable.

Fleming College Refund Policy
