The CICE program is open to adults with Developmental Disabilities, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Mild Intellectual Disabilities, or Brain Injury. CICE provides students with a unique opportunity to continue their education in an inclusive college environment.

### THROUGH THIS PROGRAM, STUDENTS:

- Strengthen independence and self-confidence in order to enhance active participation in the community
- Develop functional numeracy and literacy skills by participating in a strong academic program to reach personal, academic and vocational goals
- Choose electives from mainstream college courses, with course learning outcomes modified by an Integration Facilitator to match the individual student's learning style and capabilities
- Build workplace skills through 3 co-op placements
- Receive on-the-job training from leading employers in the Peterborough area
