## Program Highlights

Ceramics works engage every element of the design and creative process, embodying the technology, the materials, and the artist's message. The ceramic artist takes tools, materials in conjunction with contemporary sensibilities to create a broad array of objects, from vessels and fixtures to three-dimensional sculptures. Students will be encouraged to explore personal style and themes while developing the skills and techniques to design, fabricate, and finish basic ceramic forms. Drawing will be emphasized throughout the program, as a critical requirement for creative design, technical execution, and client proposals.

Equivalent to two semesters of full-time study, this 15-week program is delivered in an intensive format and features studies in fabrication, surface decoration, executing and critically assessing works in ceramics, as well as basic marketing and portfolio development.

## Why Choose Fleming

This program is delivered at Fleming College's Haliburton Campus, located in central Ontario's spectacular Haliburton Highlands region and home to the Haliburton School of The Arts, renowned for outstanding arts programming. Designed for visual artists, the contemporary architecture maximizes natural light in the studios, classrooms and common areas. It's the perfect environment to flourish as an artist.

Fleming students have unique and flexible options for earning their diploma in the visual arts. Once students have completed their certificate, they can continue their education by enrolling in two more semesters of study to complete their Visual and Creative Arts diploma. Students can continue their arts education through transfer agreements with Sheridan College, Emily Carr University of Art and Design and OCAD University. (Ontario

College of Art and Design).

The certificate programs are delivered in an intensive format in which two semesters of credits can be completed in only 15 weeks. Each certificate course comprises 32.5 hours of in-class instruction with an additional 15 hours of technician - guided, independent studio time. Faculty members are not only professional artists and designers, but also dedicated teachers who are intent upon the development of your technical skills, creative thinking, and artistic integrity. The 40-year history of the Haliburton School of The Arts is proof of the passion and focus of its faculty, administration, and support staff, whose collaboration provides an environment rich in potential for studies in the arts.

## Minimum Admission Requirements

OSSD with the majority of credits at the College (C) and Open (O) level, including:

- 2 College (C) English courses (Grade 11 or Grade 12)

When (C) is the minimum course level for admission, (U) or (U/C) courses are also accepted.

## Mature Students

If you are 19 years of age or older before classes start, and you do not possess an OSSD, you can write the Canadian Adult Achievement Test to assess your eligibility for admission.

### Related Programs

This 15-week certificate can be applied toward the Visual and Creative Arts Diploma - Specialist option. Each course week includes 32.5 hours of in-class instruction and 15 hours of independent studio work.

Graduates of the Ceramics certificate will be considered for entrance into the Sheridan College Crafts and Design advanced diploma program. Successful applicants will enter directly into the second year of the program. All applicants will be required to present a portfolio as part of the admission process.

## Additional Costs

There is an additional expense of approximately \$200 for textbooks and equipment. Other material costs are included in the tuition fee.
