- Or a University Degree in Human Services field
- Related fields include: Social Service Worker, Educational Assistant, Early Childhood Education, Drug and Alcohol Counsellor, Occupational Therapist Assistant and Physiotherapist Assistant, Massage Therapy,

### Basic Exemption: First Semester Courses

Provided that you meet the admission requirements, you will be exempted from first semester courses of the Diploma program. You will start in September, begin your next semester in January, and participate in your final semester block placement beginning in May.

*\*You will be required to pay tuition and fees for 3 semesters--including the final semester field placement.*

Graduate students who have previously completed a 15-week, Human Service-related supervised Field Practice, or a related Prior Learning Experience in the field of Recreation and Leisure Services, may qualify for a reduced time requirement for placement, as approved by the Program Coordinator.
