a community college operating in Haliburton and other locations in the province of Ontario, Canada (hereafter referred to as Fleming).


AGREEMENT OBJECTIVES

1. To facilitate access by qualified graduates of Fleming's Ceramics, Textiles Surface Design and Glassblowing Certificate programs to Sheridan's Crafts & Design Advanced Diploma program.
2. To establish eligibility criteria for Fleming students and articulate specific transfer credits.
3. To establish processes for further dialogue between Fleming and Sheridan with respect to academic partnerships.


AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Graduates of specific Fleming Certificate programs, who are accepted into Sheridan's Crafts & Design Advanced Diploma program, will be granted advanced standing as set out in Appendix A.
2. Both parties agree to encourage Fleming students to take advantage of this Articulation Agreement by providing information and advice to prospective transfer students.
3. Each institution must inform the other if substantive changes in curriculum (i.e. greater than 30%) are being determined.
4. Both parties agree to appoint and identify key individuals responsible for liaison and implementation of this Agreement (Appendix B).
5. This Agreement may be amended or modified at any time by mutual consent of the two institutions. Termination of this agreement shall allow for any participating students who have commenced their studies at Sheridan at the date of termination to complete their approved course of study.
6. This Agreement shall be in effect when both parties have signed this Agreement and shall remain in force until terminated (by either party giving the other party six months' notice).
7. Sheridan retains the right to limit the number of students admitted under this Agreement.
8. Upon successful completion of required courses at Sheridan, students will earn a three-year Advanced Diploma in Crafts & Design.


AGREEMENT OBJECTIVES

3. To establish processes for further dialogue between Sheridan and Fleming with respect to academic partnerships.


AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

4. Both parties agree to appoint and identify key individuals responsible for liaison and implementation of this Agreement (Appendix B).
5. This Agreement may be amended or modified at any time by mutual consent of the two institutions. Termination of this agreement shall allow for any participating students who have commenced their studies at Fleming at the date of termination to complete their approved course of study.
6. This Agreement shall be in effect when both parties have signed this Agreement and shall remain in force until terminated by either party giving the other party 6 months notice.
7. Fleming College retains the right to limit the number of students admitted under this Agreement.
8. Upon successful completion of required courses at Fleming, students will earn a two-year Ontario College Diploma in Visual & Creative Arts.





OSSD with the majority of credits at the college (C) and Open (O) level, including two English credits in the College (C) stream.

Mature Students – applicants who do not possess an OSSD, but who will be 19 years of age before the commencement of classes – who can demonstrate potential for success in college studies, will be considered on an individual basis. These students will be required to write the Canadian Adult Achievement Test. See page 3 for details.
