Build your career brand in the Paramedic Program at Fleming College which will prepare you to be a primary care paramedic and allow you to be eligible to write the provincial examination. Upon successful completion, you will be certified by the province through the writing of the Advanced Emergency Medical

Care Assistant – AEMCA as a Paramedic. Once you complete the program and the provincial paramedic exams, you will be eligible to work as a primary care paramedic in Paramedic services throughout Ontario, and other provinces.
