

WELCOME TO THE HALIBURTON SCHOOL OF ART + DESIGN

We're looking forward to having you with us in the inspirational Haliburton Highlands. The following details will assist you with your preparations.

Locations:

All courses will be located at **Fleming's Haliburton Campus** or **Haliburton Highlands Secondary School**, except for Blacksmithing, Iron Sculpture, Forging and Bladesmithing, which are held at Fleming's **Peel Building**, located a short drive from campus. Please consult the map included here.

Specific room locations for all courses will be emailed to you prior to course start, as well as posted at the main entrance of the campus and high school. Staff will be available to assist at both locations each Monday morning.

To accommodate shifting registration levels, last minute changes, and specific needs, room locations are determined the Thursday afternoon prior to the start of the course and are subject to change.

Hours:

Your classes will run from 9:00am to 4:30pm, Monday to Friday, with an hour midday break. Some courses are 6 days - please carefully check your course information.

Food and Beverages:

Fleming Campus: There is a small servery located at our Fleming Campus, open Monday to Friday, 8:30am to approximately 1:30pm. Additionally, there is a microwave and refrigerator available for your use.

High School: Food service at the high school is unconfirmed but details will be provided in your pre-arrival email. A number of restaurant options are located close by in the village, as well as in the surrounding area.

Accommodation:

Browse options at [Places4Students](#) – search “Fleming College – Haliburton” and then click Property Listings. We recommend that you [inquire about cancellation policies](#). In our experience, the hosts are very co-operative but it's best to clarify to avoid a situation where you lose your accommodation fees if we or you need to cancel your course.

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Course Cancellations:

All courses are subject to cancellation in the event of insufficient registration or public health directives. Should your course be cancelled due to insufficient registration, you will be notified 2 weeks in advance of course start. Ensure that we have an alternate means of reaching you if you will not be at home. Assume that your course is running as scheduled unless you hear otherwise. You are eligible for a full refund of fees or the option of transferring to another course within the current HSAD schedule (pending space availability) if the college cancels a course.

A Friendly Reminder Regarding Our Refund Policy:

- Courses are non-transferable.

If You Cancel: All notifications of cancellation must be received in writing. If you cancel any time up to 14 days prior to course start, you will receive a full refund, less a \$25 administrative fee. If you cancel later than 14 days prior to course start, there is no refund of fees. This policy applies in all circumstances due to our commitment to students and instructors two weeks prior to course start. Should you be able to attend a different course within the current schedule we would be happy to attempt to accommodate you, pending space availability. NO OPEN TOE OR HEEL SHOES IN CLASSROOM/STUDIOS

Please bring:

- Good quality pencils (HB or 2B) and an eraser
- Drawing paper – an inexpensive pad of medium or large sized drawing paper or newsprint is fine. If you wish to keep or display your sketches purchase an acid-free paper
- Reference photos – At least 20 but the more the better! Choose subjects you enjoy drawing such as a favourite animal or a family pet. A clear, sharp image will be easier to work from.

DRY MEDIUMS: Bring whatever you wish to use

- Pencils (artist grade pencils make a huge difference)
- Coloured pencils - wax and/or oil base in the best quality you can afford. You can easily work with a few basic colours bought from open stock.
- Pastels (soft or chalk)
- Pen
- Ink – acrylic or India etc

PAINT: Again bring what you'd like to practice with

- Watercolours (blocks or tubes - in a set or individual colours)
- Acrylic paint - if you're a beginner this is a forgiving medium
- Plastic water container
- Paint palette

SURFACES

- PENCIL or COLOURED PENCIL - sanded papers such as Pastelmat, smooth or vellum Bristol paper, Stonehenge in white or toned, or other quality drawing paper. Hot press watercolour is also great for pencil crayon and graphite
- WATERCOLOUR or INK – 140 lb Hot or Cold press paper in a pad, block or individual sheets. GOOD QUALITY watercolour paper is important and will make a huge difference
- ACRYLIC: Canvas boards or sheets (inexpensive and great to practice on), stretched canvas, illustration board
- PASTEL: a sanded paper or a textured pastel paper

BRUSHES: A small selection of shapes and sizes is useful

- For acrylic you will need brushes with stiffer bristles
- For watercolour you need brushes that hold a lot of water

MISCELLANEOUS:

- Masking tape
- Baby wipes
- Tracing paper
- Roll of toilet paper or paper towels

Mandatory Studio Safety Practices

Your health and safety is our priority. Our studio environments can have a number of objects, tools and chemicals that require personal protective equipment (PPE) or other consideration for your wellbeing. All persons (including faculty, staff and students) are asked to observe the following while in the shops and studios:

- ✓ **Wear sturdy and appropriate shoes such as sneakers, closed leather shoes or work boots – *open-toed shoes, flip-flops or high heels are not allowed***
- ✓ **No long, dangling clothing or accessories** (scarves, flowing sleeves, chains, long necklaces, etc.)
- ✓ **Long hair must be tied back**
- ✓ **No bare skin if exposure to chemical or tools/machinery is likely**
- ✓ **Appropriate PPE is mandatory when operating tools and equipment within the studios.** Please consult with the faculty or studio technician to determine the appropriate PPE required for specific machines and studio processes.

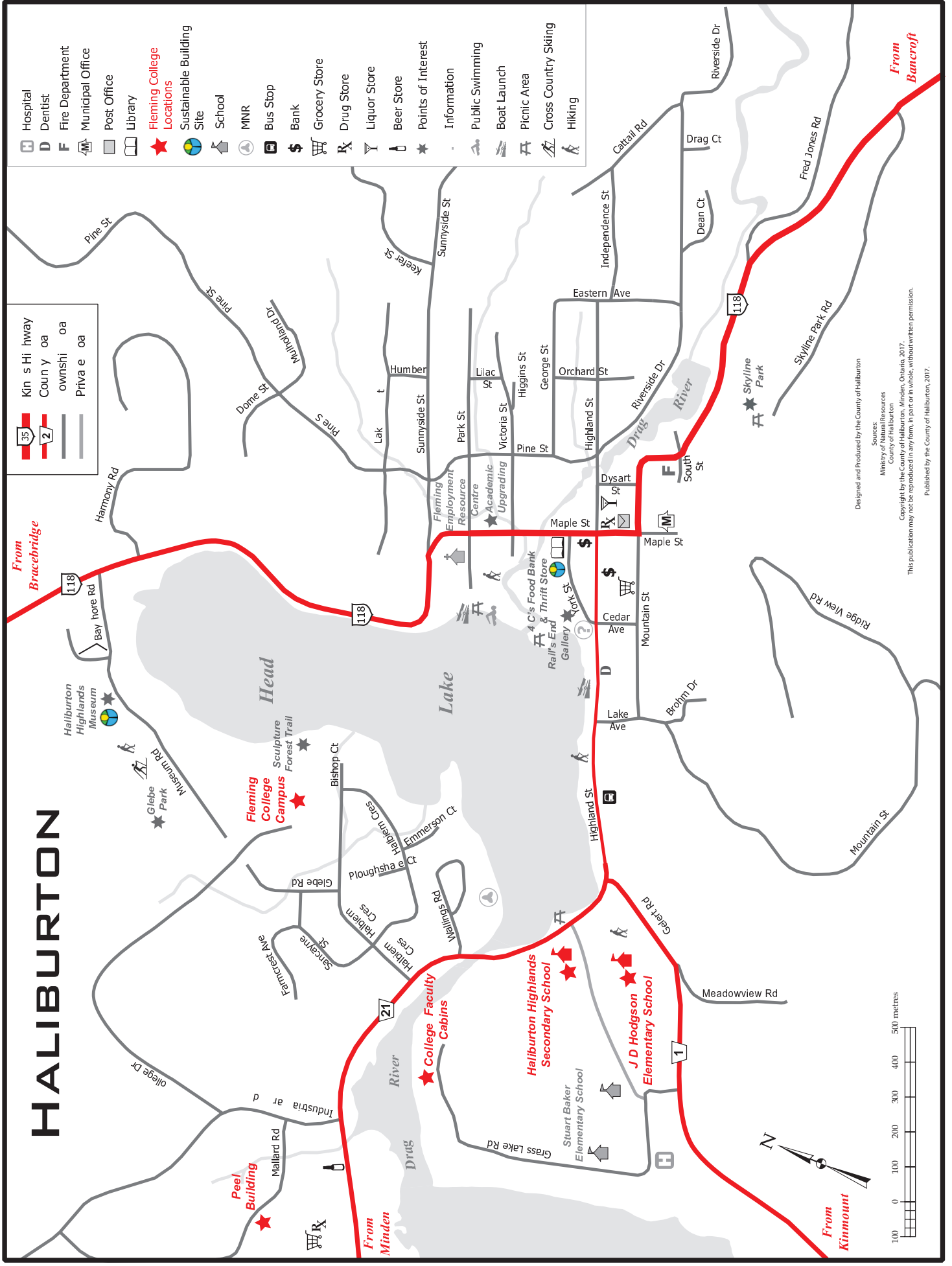
Fit tests are required for courses requiring a respirator as noted on your material list. Arrangements will be made on site.

As these are mandatory safety practices, we will follow up directly with students who may have oversighted the above. Individuals may be asked to address any concerns before continuing to work in the studio.

Be sure to buy appropriate, good quality safety articles and equipment i.e. safety boots, protective eyewear, hearing protection, work gloves, x-acto knives, etc. – ask your supplier for advice.
