

## WELCOME TO THE HALIBURTON SCHOOL OF ART + DESIGN

We're looking forward to having you with us in the inspirational Haliburton Highlands. The following details will assist you with your preparations.

### Locations:

All courses will be located at **Fleming's Haliburton Campus** or **Haliburton Highlands Secondary School**, except for Blacksmithing, Iron Sculpture, Forging and Bladesmithing, which are held at Fleming's **Peel Building**, located a short drive from campus. Please consult the map included here.

Specific room locations for all courses will be emailed to you prior to course start, as well as posted at the main entrance of the campus and high school. Staff will be available to assist at both locations each Monday morning.

To accommodate shifting registration levels, last minute changes, and specific needs, room locations are determined the Thursday afternoon prior to the start of the course and are subject to change.

### Hours:

Your classes will run from 9:00am to 4:30pm, Monday to Friday, with an hour midday break. Some courses are 6 days - please carefully check your course information.

### Food and Beverages:

Fleming Campus: There is a small servery located at our Fleming Campus, open Monday to Friday, 8:30am to approximately 1:30pm. Additionally, there is a microwave and refrigerator available for your use.

High School: Food service at the high school is unconfirmed but details will be provided in your pre-arrival email. A number of restaurant options are located close by in the village, as well as in the surrounding area.

### Accommodation:

We recommend that you [inquire about cancellation policies](#). In our experience, the hosts are very co-operative but it's best to clarify to avoid a situation where you lose your accommodation fees if we or you need to cancel your course.

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**Course Cancellations:**

All courses are subject to cancellation in the event of insufficient registration or public health directives. Should your course be cancelled due to insufficient registration, you will be notified 2 weeks in advance of course start. Ensure that we have an alternate means of reaching you if you will not be at home. Assume that your course is running as scheduled unless you hear otherwise. You are eligible for a full refund of fees or the option of transferring to another course within the current HSAD schedule (pending space availability) if the college cancels a course.

**A Friendly Reminder Regarding Our Refund Policy:**

- Courses are non-transferable.

If You Cancel: All notifications of cancellation must be received in writing. If you cancel any time up to 14 days prior to course start, you will receive a full refund, less a \$25 administrative fee. If you cancel later than 14 days prior to course start, there is no refund of fees. This policy applies in all circumstances due to our commitment to students and instructors two weeks prior to course start. Should you be able to attend a different course within the current schedule we would be happy to attempt to accommodate you, pending space availability. 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# MATERIAL LIST

## BATIK RESISTS ON ASIAN & WATERCOLOUR PAPERS

Please check the status of your course before purchasing materials!

**Mandatory Studio Safety Practices apply – Reference the attached**  
**NO OPEN TOE OR HEEL SHOES IN THE STUDIO**

There will be a \$75 material fee payable on the first day of class to the instructor. This fee covers bees/paraffin wax, 6 sheets large mulberry &/or rice papers, butcher paper, wood blocks, erasers for stamps, gold leaf papers, cording and wire, plaster gauze, copper wire, hot glue sticks and glue guns, 3 sheets of watercolour paper (10 x12”), India ink, watercolour washes prepared, oil pastels, embroidery thread and needles. You will be given unlimited bees & paraffin wax for Batik on paper.

**Please bring:**

- Pencils - variety, pencil crayons, eraser, ruler
- Masking tape
- One Bristol board or cardboard approx. 18” x 24”
- Scissors
- Acrylic Paint: 1 tube each of Gold, silver, red, yellow, blue (turquoise, magenta, copper, black and any other colours are optional) – The brand name Golden are excellent but any acrylics (dollar store) will suffice depending on your budget and/or experience.
- Paint Brushes: 3 sizes of watercolour or any soft bristle brushes, 3 sizes of acrylic or stiffer bristle brushes, package of foam brushes (variety of sizes). The brushes do not have to be expensive. Check out hardware stores for a variety packs
- 3 water containers
- 1 small bottle of Sobo glue 8 oz (Available at Michaels) or Well bond glue (Canadian Tire)
- Acrylic gloss medium – 8 oz bottle
- 10 small sized canning jars with lids or any plastic containers with lids (yogurt, cottage cheese)
- Plastic plates (can cover with saran wrap for a paint palette and to save the plate)
- Exacto knife
- Self-healing cutting board (small or medium sized) - Optional
- Sketch book – black, bound 9” x 11” or larger (please no wire bound books), instructor will have some to purchase if she knows ahead of time via e-mail (this will be collaged on)
- Small collection of papers –foils, tickets, music sheets, dollar store papers etc.)
- Embroidery floss – variety of colours, variety of sewing needles, 1 large needle
- Paper towels or rags

- Any rice or mulberry papers, (instructor will have some to purchase), and any other papers that you have around or find interesting that are a natural fiber. These can be purchase from the art supplier on campus or instructor as needed. Also students my purchase canvases or birch wood frames for collage work on campus if needed.
- Freezer paper or wax paper
- Spritzer for water
- 1 sheet of watercolour paper (1 hot press)
- 2 pkg of newsprint paper (can be purchased on campus)
- Beads, ribbons, stuff for embellishments
- Spoon or small whisk for mixing paint
- 2 CD's that you find inspiring
- Bring in one object that resonates with you (manmade or organic) to use as an inspiration during discussions.

## **Mandatory Studio Safety Practices**

Your health and safety is our priority. Our studio environments can have a number of objects, tools and chemicals that require personal protective equipment (PPE) or other consideration for your wellbeing. All persons (including faculty, staff and students) are asked to observe the following while in the shops and studios:

- ✓ **Wear sturdy and appropriate shoes such as sneakers, closed leather shoes or work boots – *open-toed shoes, flip-flops or high heels are not allowed***
- ✓ **No long, dangling clothing or accessories** (scarves, flowing sleeves, chains, long necklaces, etc.)
- ✓ **Long hair must be tied back**
- ✓ **No bare skin if exposure to chemical or tools/machinery is likely**
- ✓ **Appropriate PPE is mandatory when operating tools and equipment within the studios.** Please consult with the faculty or studio technician to determine the appropriate PPE required for specific machines and studio processes.

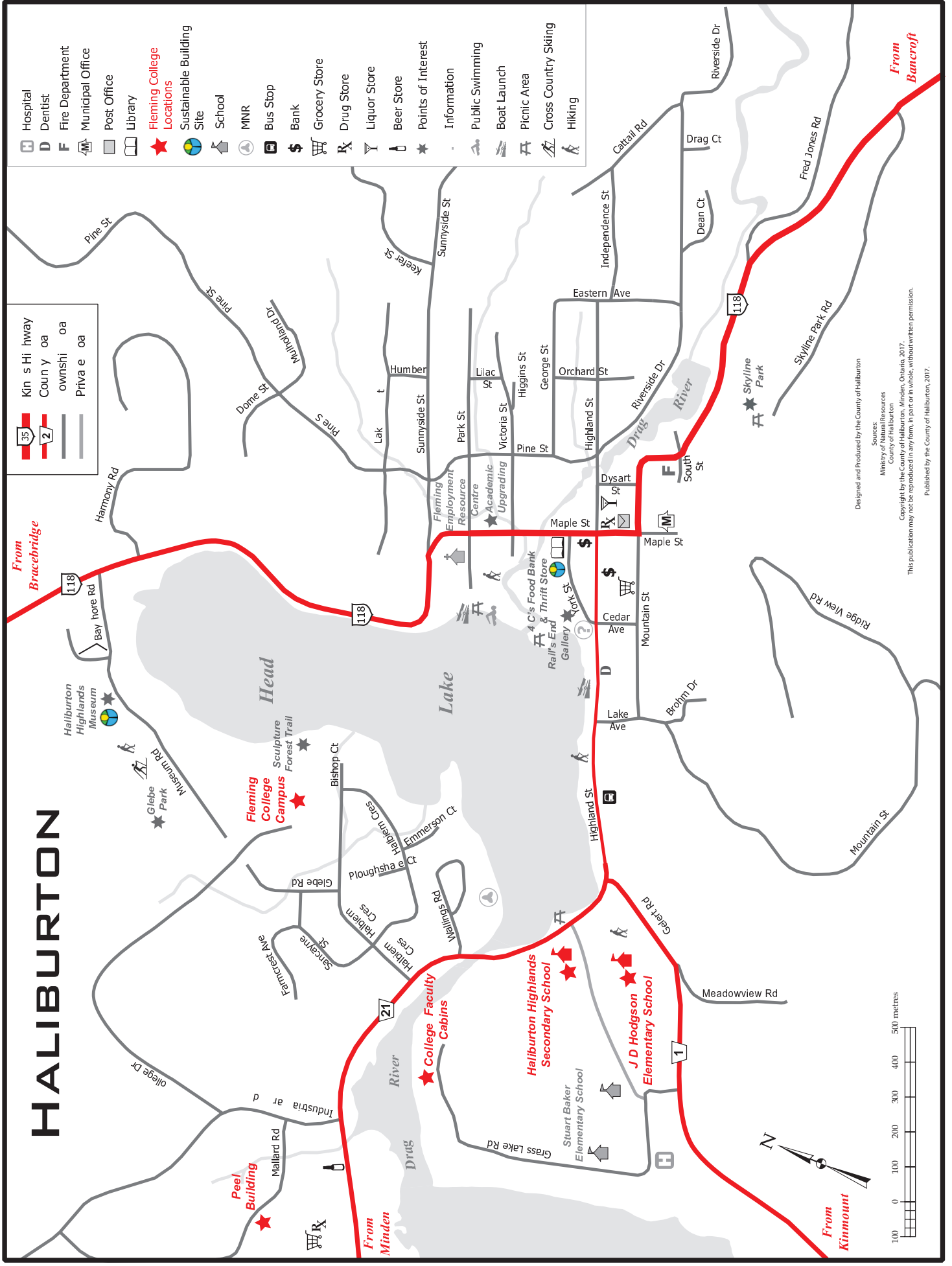
**Fit tests** are required for courses requiring a respirator as noted on your material list. Arrangements will be made on site.

As these are mandatory safety practices, we will follow up directly with students who may have oversights the above. Individuals may be asked to address any concerns before continuing to work in the studio.

Be sure to buy appropriate, good quality safety articles and equipment i.e. safety boots, protective eyewear, hearing protection, work gloves, x-acto knives, etc. – ask your supplier for advice.
