We're looking forward to having you with us in the inspirational Haliburton Highlands. The following details will assist you with your preparations.

Locations:

Saturday workshops are held at the Fleming Campus, 297 College Drive, unless otherwise indicated on your material list. Specific room locations for all workshops will be emailed to you prior to course start, as well as posted at the main entrances of Fleming Campus. It's a small campus and very easy to find rooms. Please see the map included here.

Hours:

Your classes will run from 9:00am to 5:00pm on Saturday, with an hour midday break.

Food and Beverages:

Please be aware that there is no food service on Saturdays. There are vending machines with drinks and limited snacks. We encourage you to bring food in a personal cooler bag.

Covid 19 safety measures:

As the province continues to ease Covid-19 restrictions, Fleming College is currently reviewing Spring/Summer protocols and will provide update once confirmed.

Accommodation:

We recommend that you inquire about cancellation policies. In our experience, the hosts are very co-operative but it's best to clarify to avoid a situation where you lose your accommodation fees if we or you need to cancel your course.

Materials you need to bring:

Where applicable, a list of materials necessary for your workshop(s) is enclosed. Materials will not be available for purchase on site – we suggest you bring everything with you. *Please feel free to check the status of your course if you are concerned about investing in materials.* There are some art supplies available at local retail outlets.

Course Cancellations:

All courses and workshops are subject to cancellation in the event of insufficient registration or public health directives. Should your workshop be cancelled due to insufficient registration, you will be notified 2 weeks in advance of start. Please ensure that we have multiple means of reaching you. Assume that your workshop is running as scheduled unless you hear otherwise. You are eligible for a full refund of fees or the option of transferring to another offering within the current HSAD schedule (pending space availability) if the college cancels a course.

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A Friendly Reminder Regarding Our Refund Policy:

- Workshops are non-transferable.

If You Cancel: All notifications of cancellation must be received in writing. If you cancel any time up to 14 days prior to course start, you will receive a full refund less a \$25 administrative fee. If you cancel later than 14 days prior to course start, there is no refund of fees. This policy applies in all circumstances due to our commitment to students and instructors two weeks prior to course start. Should you be able to attend a different course within the current HSAD brochure we would be happy to attempt to accommodate you, pending space availability. QUILTING – BARGELLO WAVE WORKSHOP

Mandatory Studio Safety Practices apply – Reference the attached
NO OPEN TOE OR HEEL SHOES IN THE STUDIO

Please bring:

- Sewing Machine in good working order
- ¼” sewing foot – or masking tape to mark the ¼” on your machine
- Rotary Cutter with a sharp blade
- Cutting mat at least 24” x 36”
- 100% cotton thread 50-weight is preferable – medium grey blends nicely with a wide variety of colours.
- 80/12 needles (this size matches the above thread) – bring several
- Scissors, thread snips, straight pins, seam ripper, Ruby Beholder and value finder (for sorting your fabrics into light to dark sequences) or use a camera, or cell phone grey scale.
- Fabric – The Wave Quilt uses 24 fabrics – 16 in your main colour group (let’s say blue) and 8 in a similar colour group (blue-green-turquoise). Fabrics in each colour group should range from light to dark, including various scales and textures, a couple out of your comfort zone, plus a “zinger” or two to add sparkle and movement to your quilt. I like to start with a “zinger” or 2 - and work my way out.
- Yardage is based on 42” wide fabric and a finished quilt size of 78” square - 1/2 yard each of 24 fabrics – if you want a larger quilt you can add a border.
- (In the workshop you will complete one quarter of the quilt. The other 3 quarters can be completed later – and we will discuss batting, backing and finishing).

WHAT TO EXPECT IN CLASS

We will start our day with introductions, and pattern and information handouts, followed by a brief discussion about colour value. You will then arrange and number your fabrics, sew into sets and cut the sets into varying widths. TO SAVE TIME IN CLASS - YOU CAN PREPARE THESE STRIPS PRIOR TO CLASS. I will email you a colour chart. After lunch we will start the piecing process and you will create “the wave” and be ready to complete the rest of the quilt at your leisure. Followed by a quick show and share at the end of the day.

Mandatory Studio Safety Practices

Your health and safety is our priority. Our studio environments can have a number of objects, tools and chemicals that require personal protective equipment (PPE) or other consideration for your wellbeing. All persons (including faculty, staff and students) are asked to observe the following while in the shops and studios:

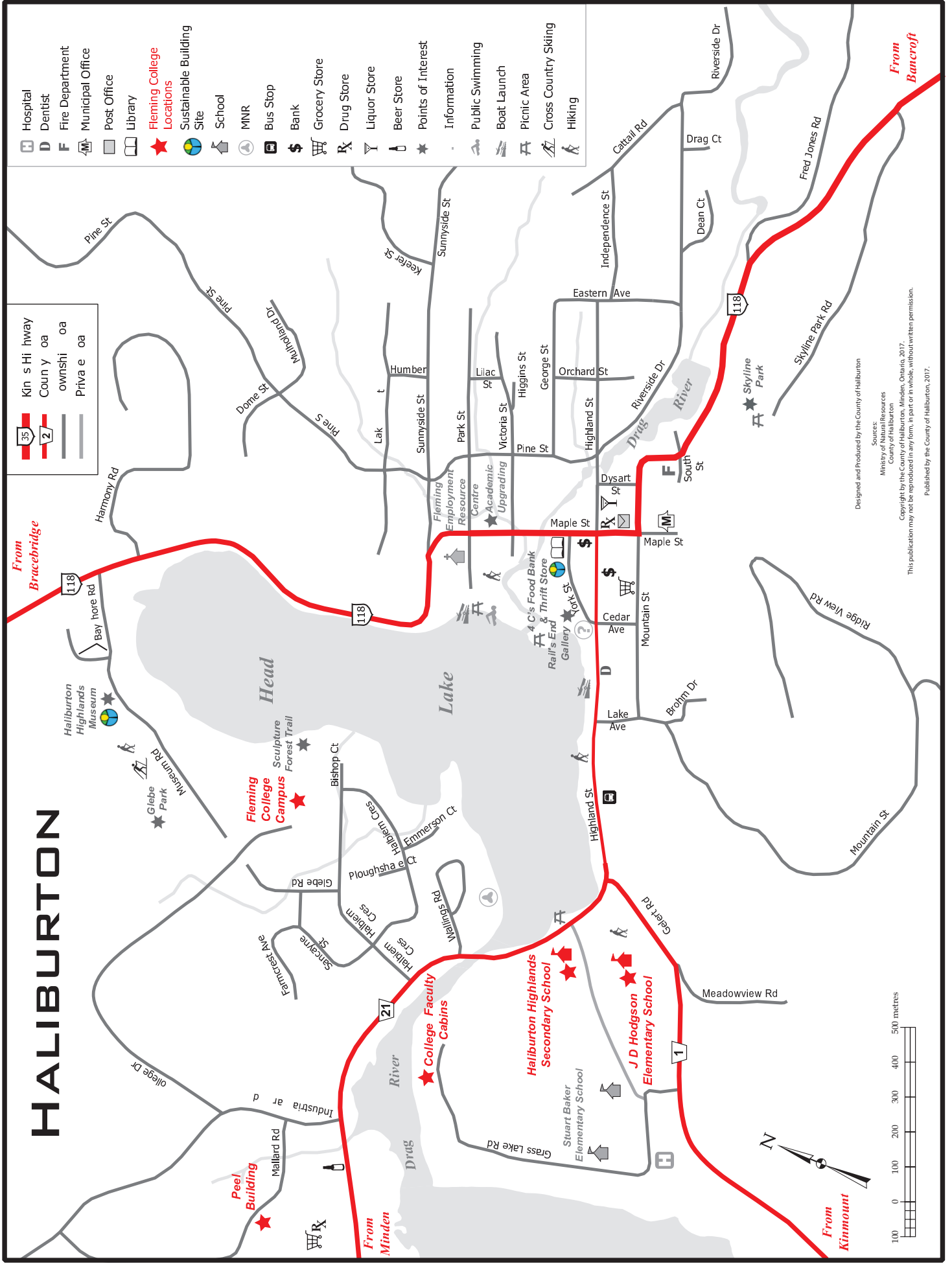
- ✓ **Wear sturdy and appropriate shoes such as sneakers, closed leather shoes or work boots – *open-toed shoes, flip-flops or high heels are not allowed***
- ✓ **No long, dangling clothing or accessories** (scarves, flowing sleeves, chains, long necklaces, etc.)
- ✓ **Long hair must be tied back**
- ✓ **No bare skin if exposure to chemical or tools/machinery is likely**
- ✓ **Appropriate PPE is mandatory when operating tools and equipment within the studios.** Please consult with the faculty or studio technician to determine the appropriate PPE required for specific machines and studio processes.

As these are mandatory safety practices, we will follow up directly with students who may have overlooked the above. Individuals may be asked to address any concerns before continuing to work in the studio.

Be sure to buy appropriate, good quality safety articles and equipment i.e. safety boots, protective eyewear, hearing protection, work gloves, x-acto knives, etc. – ask your supplier for advice.
