

# WELCOME TO THE HALIBURTON SCHOOL OF ART + DESIGN

We're looking forward to having you with us in the inspirational Haliburton Highlands. The following details will assist you with your preparations.

#### Locations:

All courses, unless otherwise specified, are held at the Haliburton Fleming College campus, located at 297 College Drive. Please refer to our online map of Haliburton village to assist you with travel.

#### Hours:

Your classes will run from 9:00am to 4:30pm, Monday to Friday, unless otherwise specified, with an hour midday lunch break.

#### **Food and Beverages:**

There is a small servery on campus open Monday to Friday, 8:30am to approximately 1:30pm. Additionally, there is a microwave and refrigerator available for your use.

#### **Accommodation:**

Browse options at Places4Students – search "Fleming College – Haliburton" and then click Property Listings. Additional accommodation information is available through the Haliburton Highlands Tourism department which can also be reached at 1-800-461-7677. We recommend that you inquire about cancellation policies. In our experience, the hosts are very co-operative but it's best to clarify to avoid a situation where you lose your accommodation fees if we or you need to cancel your course (which we will notify you of 2 weeks prior).

### Materials you need to bring:

Where applicable, a list of materials necessary for your course is included in this document. Minimal materials are available for purchase on site (unlike previous years, we may NOT have an art supplier on site) – we suggest you bring everything with you. Please feel free to check the status of your course if you are concerned about investing in materials. There are some limited arts supplies available at local retail outlets.

#### **Course Cancellations:**

All courses are subject to cancellation in the event of insufficient registration or public health directives. Should your course be cancelled due to insufficient registration, you will be notified 2 weeks in advance of course start by email and/or phone on file. Ensure that we have an alternate means of reaching you if you will not be at home. Assume that your course is running as scheduled unless you hear otherwise. You are eligible for a full refund of fees or the option of transferring to another course within the current HSAD schedule (pending space availability) if the college cancels a course.

#### **Refund Policy:**

- If You Cancel: All notifications of cancellation must be received in writing. If you cancel any time up to 14 days prior to course start, you will receive a full refund, less a \$25 administrative fee. If you cancel later than 14 days prior to course start, fees will not be refunded. This policy applies in all circumstances due to our commitment to students and instructors two weeks prior to course start. Should you be able to attend a different course within the current schedule/year we would be happy to attempt to accommodate you, pending space availability.
- Courses are non-transferable.

# Mandatory Studio Safety Practices apply – See below NO OPEN-TOE OR HEEL SHOES IN THE STUDIO

A \$15 material fee payable to the instructor will be needed on your first day of class. This fee will cover a large, diverse supply of communal collage materials the instructor will bring.

# Please bring:

This is an exhaustive list of options. You don't need to bring everything listed here. You may have personal choices you may want to bring too, great!

#### **CORE Materials:**

#### **Basic Tools**

- · Pencils and erasers
- Ruler
- Colour wheel
- Masking tape (Painter's preferable good for temporary holds)
- Phone (for camera)
- USB stick (for printing images in class)

#### **Cutting Tools**

- Scissors
- Your choice of knives and cutting mat

#### Glues

 A glue stick is simple and versatile for porous materials like paper and cardboard. I recommend.

# UHU! (Bring more than one!)

Additionally, the liquid acrylic medium also works very well as a glue - it comes as gloss and mat - the gloss dries completely clear, whereas the mat dulls colours down, especially in layers, so I suggest using gloss for all your layering, and then a final layer of a mix of gloss and mat as a final coat to get the amount of shine desired on finished pieces. For heavier-duty holds you can use gel medium, white glue, glue gun, etc.

# Substrates

A supply of decently heavy paper to use as bases. I recommend a pad or two of inexpensive but workmanlike watercolour paper or mixed media paper like Canson XL (140 lb) 9x12" - 12x18". But you can also bring other papers and surfaces in whatever sizes you prefer to work. Try to bring a few larger options for more ambitious work: heavy papers, light cardstock, heavier drawing paper, illustration or mat board. If you want to use canvases and/or wood panels, by all means, go for it. I prefer the solidity of wood panels for collaging (vs the bounce of canvas).

#### **Collage Materials**

• Can include - images, patterns, colours, textures, newspapers, books, packaging, magazines, painted papers, gift wrap, scrapbooking papers, specialty papers, tissue papers, coloured papers (from cheap construction paper for quick, fun stuff to fancier Japanese papers, etc), fabric scraps, old paintings, etc.

We will dedicate a central table for class-sharing collage materials, and I will bring lots of magazines, books, etc. for your use.

# **Online Image Sources**

- Of course, you can simply do Google image searches if you're going to re-work any image enough cut pieces out, recontextualize, paint/collage over, etc. copyright no longer applies. Just be sure that your new creation is clearly more about what you made it into than the original intent of the source image.
- Plus, here are a couple of great places to look for and download copyright-free images:
- <u>Flickr Commons</u> -Copyright-free images from dozens of Archives, Libraries, museums, and other organizations around the world.
- <u>Pixabay</u> -1.6 million high-quality copyright-free images.
- A colour inkjet printer that prints 8.5x11" will be available for you to print images from a USB stick at a cost of \$1/page onto premium bond paper.

But to avoid waits and possible tech issues, I suggest that you print as much as you can at home to bring with you.

# **Optional**

- Painting papers to collage with is a great way to get custom colours and textures.
   Acrylics are perfect since once they're dry, they're not re-soluble. A good minimalist option is a warm and cool version of each primary, i.e.:
  - Cadmium Yellow Medium and Lemon Yellow or Hansa or Cad. Yellow Light
  - Cad. Red Medium and Alizarin Crimson or Quinacridone Magenta
  - Phthalo Blue Green Shade and Ultramarine Blue
  - Black
  - White
- Palette and a few brushes a wide-ish one is good for painting full sheets If you're going to paint paper for collaging, I suggest a sketchbook with 80-100lb paper
- Tweezers if working with small pieces
- I like to buy scrapbooking paper pads at Walmart or Michaels you can find some great solid colours, textures, patterns, etc. and they're often acid-free
- Thrift stores can be great places to find old books and magazines.

#### **Drawing materials**

• Conté, charcoal, nib pens and ink, pigment liners, paint markers, coloured pencils, pastels, etc.

# **MANDATORY STUDIO SAFETY PRACTICES**

Your health and safety is our priority. Our studio environments can have a number of objects, tools and chemicals that require personal protective equipment (PPE) or other consideration for your wellbeing. All persons (including faculty, staff and students) are asked to observe the following while in the shops and studios:

- Wear sturdy and appropriate shoes such as sneakers, closed leather shoes or work boots *open-toed shoes, flip-flops or high heels are not allowed*
- No long, dangling clothing or accessories (scarves, flowing sleeves, chains, long necklaces, etc.)
- Long hair must be tied back
- No bare skin if exposure to chemical or tools/machinery is likely
- Appropriate PPE is mandatory when operating tools and equipment within the studios.
   Please consult with the faculty or studio technician to determine the appropriate PPE required for specific machines and studio processes.

**Fit tests** are required for courses requiring a respirator as noted on your material list. Arrangements will be made on site.

As these are mandatory safety practices, we will follow up directly with students who may have oversighted the above. Individuals may be asked to address any concerns before continuing to work in the studio.

Be sure to buy appropriate, good quality safety articles and equipment i.e. safety boots, protective eyewear, hearing protection, work gloves, x-acto knives, etc. – ask your supplier for advice.
