


A FULFILLING FUTURE AWAITS

Workplace Pathways

Admission requirements: OSSD with the majority of credits at the Workplace (E) level, including English. When Workplace (E) is the minimum course level for admission, (C) and (U/C) level courses are also accepted. Note: OLC 40 meets the English requirement.



Heavy Equipment Operator

12-week Certificate, Lindsay Campus.

In a hands-on learning environment students develop the skills to operate bulldozers, graders, backhoes, excavators and other construction site equipment.

Blasting Techniques

2-semester Certificate, Lindsay Campus.

The only program of its kind in Canada.

This highly practical hands-on program uses labs and field classes to focus on explosions, drilling and blasting, geology and safety.

2-semester Certificate, Peterborough Campus.

Graduate with a variety of trade-specific skills that could land you employment with independent contractors or be your pathway to a plumbing apprenticeship.

Compressed, 3-semester Certificate, Peterborough Campus.

Graduates will have completed all required in-school training hours for the Hairstylist 332A Level 1 and 2 Apprenticeship. You will learn and practice the latest skills in hairstyling techniques in the newly designed on-campus salon within Fleming's Spa + Clinic multidisciplinary environment.

Motive Power Technician - Recreational and Sport Vehicles

3-semester Diploma, Peterborough Campus.

OR

Motive Power Technician - Recreational and Sport Vehicles (Co-op)

4-semester Diploma, Peterborough Campus

With a focus on four areas of transportation maintenance this program offers a unique breadth of skills training. Graduates will be in demand across various sectors including marine, aviation and recreational vehicles. Apprenticeship training within the curriculum allows students to pursue an apprenticeship when employed.

Blasting Techniques	The only program of its kind in Canada. Direct entry into 2 nd semester Resources Drilling Technician (Optional Co-op).
Hairstyling	Combine art and science to become a licensed professional hairstylist. Learn the latest techniques and entrepreneurial skills from award-winning professionals. Graduates will have completed all required in-school training hours for the Hairstylist 332A Level 1 and 2 Apprenticeship.
Heavy Equipment Operator	Graduate with skills to operate a variety of heavy equipment and learn about worksite and equipment safety.
Mechanical Techniques - Plumbing	Gain trade-specific skills. Graduates are eligible to receive the Level 1 Plumbing Apprenticeship exemption. Earn transfer credits to reduce your workload if you choose to enter an additional trades program.
Motive Power Technician - Recreational and Sport Vehicles OR	Graduates will receive Level 1 in-school apprenticeship training for: Small Engine Technician – 435A, Marine Engine Technician – 435B, Turf Equipment Technician – 421C, Recreational Vehicle Technician – 690H* * Students will also complete their RV-2 LPG Certification (Recreational Vehicle Technician - 690H), which is required
Motive Power Technician - Recreational and Sport Vehicles (Co-op)	for students to advance to Level 2 of this apprenticeship.
Personal Support Worker	Graduates may be eligible for the Bridge to Practical Nursing program. Once part-time bridge courses are completed, enter directly into 2 nd semester of the Practical Nursing diploma program.
Trade Fundamentals	A sampler of basic level trades courses. Graduates can apply to semester 1 of Trades & Technology diplomas.
