Intense immersion, in and out of the classroom

- » Students participate in an elective workshop, such as Pronunciation, Grammar Essentials, Social Conversation, Book Club, and Idioms and Expressions. These small-group workshops focus strongly on individual practice.
- » One morning or afternoon each week is dedicated to a field trip to apply language skills to a specific situation, become familiar with Canadian culture and explore the natural environment of the Peterborough and Kawarthas region.
- » Students have 24/7 access to web based language learning software.
- » Personalized learning: each week students receive private tutoring for 30 minutes.

Pathway Opportunities

Post-Secondary Diplomas: Level 8 graduates can articulate directly into a post-secondary diploma program at Fleming College if they earn a minimum of 70% on course work, 70% on the Fleming College English as a Second Language Bridge program exit test and meet program specific admission requirements.

Post-Grad Certificates: Level 8 graduates can articulate directly into a post-grad program at Fleming College if they earn a minimum of 80% on course work, 80% on the Fleming College English as a Second Language Bridge program exit test and meet program-specific admission requirements.
